

GUIDELINES

1. Burn permits are issued for the open burning of trees, brush, shrubs and limbs solely for the purpose of land clearance. **Burning of leaves is not allowed.**
2. Approved burn permits are valid for a period of ten (10) days.
3. The Pryor Creek Fire Department shall be contacted each time the person or resident wishes to burn during the approved 10 day period. Permission will be granted by a representative of the Pryor Fire Department. To obtain permission call 918 825 3131 and is granted on a daily basis.
4. Once permission is granted, no burn permit site shall be left unattended for any period of time unless the fire has been completely extinguished.
5. The burn permit site and materials to be burned are subject to inspection at any time during the 10 day period by any representative of the Pryor Fire Department.
6. The following safety precautions must be followed:
 - A. Gasoline or Diesel cannot be used to ignite fire:
 - B. Residential burn piles shall be located a minimum of 50' from all structures and minimum of 30' from all public roadways.
 - C. Commercial burn piles shall be located on property of at least 1 acre, shall be located minimum of 300' from all structures, 50' feet from all public roadways.
 - D. Wind cannot exceed 10 miles per hour and must be in direction as approved by inspector.
 - E. All burn piles shall be located minimum of 30' from all overhead wires and cables for residential and 50' for commercial.
 - F. There shall be a 10 foot perimeter clear of all vegetation surrounding residential burn piles and 20 feet commercial burn piles.
7. All burning must be completely extinguished 1 hour prior to official sun down.
8. No burning before official sun up.
9. Any person or resident obtaining a burn permit does so at his / her own risk and in no event shall any liability or damage be imposed upon the representative or City of Pryor Creek approving the permit if damages and or injury are sustained as a result of any burning.
10. Legal owner of property must provide authorization to burn.
11. Proof of liability insurance is required.
12. Failure to comply with any provision of the permit and or its application will result in fine of minimum of cost of fire run outside of City limits for one vehicle and not to exceed the cost of two vehicles.
