WHEREAS, in April of 1968 on of the Nation's most important pieces if civil rights legislation – Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968 – was adopted by the U.S. Congress; and

WHEREAS, Title VIII prohibits a wide range of discriminatory housing practices; and

WHEREAS, the Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988 strengthens the mandate to each community to affirmatively further fair housing opportunities; and

WHEREAS, communities receiving Community Development Block Grant funds are uniquely situated to positively impact housing opportunities; and

WHEREAS, in affirmatively furthering fair housing, CDBG communities are required to actively promote wider housing opportunities for all racial and ethnic groups while maintaining a nondiscriminatory environment in all aspects of the public and private housing market within their jurisdiction.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma, wholeheartedly proclaim April as Fair Housing Month, and proclaims that activities will be undertaken to alert citizens and private housing organizations to the City's commitment toward affirmatively furthering fair housing such as design and distribution of brochures on Fair Housing Laws and distribution of letters to local Realtors regarding the Fair Housing Act.

### **BETWEEN**

- Bart Heins, of "Fiber Interactive Technologies", an LLC organized and existing under the laws of the state of OKLAHOMA, with its head office located at: 24 South Adair, Pryor, OK 74361.

collectively referred to as the "Parties".

### **RECITALS**

The Buyer wishes to be provided with the Services (defined below) by the Service Provider and the Service Provider agrees to provide the Services to the Buyer on the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

### 1. Key Terms

### 1.1 Services

The Service Provider shall provide the following services ("Services") to the Buyer in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement:

### 1.2 Delivery of the Services

- c. Key Dates: The Service Provider agrees to provide the following parts of the Services at the specific dates set out below: Signature is expected at time of delivery of this document and will go into force immediately.

### 1.3 **Site**

The Service Provider shall provide the Services at the following site(s): City of Pryor Creek City Hall 12 North Rowe, Pryor, OK 74361 and other City of Pryor locations that have paid for Office as a Service.

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### 1.4 Price

As consideration for the provision of the Services by the Service Provider, the price for the provision of the Services is based on the following table based on number of devices signed up for service ("Price").

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- b. All units at a location must be included in the service. In other words, no PCs, Servers, or Phones may be excluded at a location if other like systems are being covered without express written approval from Fiber Interactive Technologies.
- 36 month hardware replacement is NOT included as part of this service. The City of Pryor Creek will be responsible for upgrading hardware and for any repairs associated with City of Pryor Creek owned hardware.

### 1.5 Payment

- The Buyer shall pay such invoices within 30 days of their receipt from the Service Provider except where stipulated in clauses 1.5(b) and 1.5(c).

- ii. credit card payment through **Freshbooks**Any charges payable under this Agreement are exclusive of any applicable taxes, tariff surcharges or other like amounts assessed by any governmental entity arising as a result of the provision of the Services by the Service Provider to the Buyer under this Agreement and such shall be payable by the Buyer to the Service Provider in addition to all other charges payable hereunder.

### 1.6 Support Information

### Deploy

New computers are configured with a standard set of software including a current operating system, licensed and subscribed software applications, anti-virus/anti-spyware software, and remote management and support tools.

- Computers are configured for compliance with City of Pryor Creek security policies, and other configurations that may be specific to divisions or units.
- Computer setup includes:
  - Migration of applications, client documents, and preferences from a previous computer. Client data is kept for a minimum of two weeks to ensure complete data transfer.
  - Configuration of printing to networked printers
  - Physical relocation of computers. Multiple computer moves should be coordinated with Moving Services or divisional facilities staff.

### **Operating System and Application Patching**

### **Managed Computer Configuration**

Fiber Interactive Technologies may remotely apply configuration changes to managed computers in response to client requests, to improve endpoint security, or to prevent problems from affecting computers.

### Computer Repairs

- Support for computer repairs includes equipment pickup, shipping, tracking, and return. Completion of repairs is verified. The City of Pryor Creek will be invoiced according to section 1.5 for any hardware repair work.
- Non-warranty repair is provided for standard computers for which the manufacturer warranty has expired. Repair by support technicians includes replacement of user-serviceable parts provided by the customer. Please note that Fiber Interactive Technologies cannot reimburse departments for recommended repairs/parts that do not resolve the problem. Some hardware issues may be beyond the scope of non-warranty repair help. Clients may need to utilize a third-party vendor for non-user-serviceable part repair.

### Printing

Printing functions of standard networked printers are supported including deployment and configuration of printer settings, registration, and printing from business systems. Support staff apply a standard Secure Printer Configuration checklist when setting up or working with networked printers. - Fiber Interactive Technologies support staff have the ability to remotely control the computer with the client's authorization for each remote control session. Remote control may be prohibited in specific high-security environments.

### **Network Equipment and Hardware**

- Fiber Interactive Technologies will make all necessary Network Equipment changes to support Moves, Adds, and Changes to the Voice Network.

### Server Virtualization

Fiber Interactive Technologies will host in our secure data center virtual servers that support either Windows Server or Linux Operating Systems.

- Our experts will keep the server running and up to date with Security patches, OS updates, and more. We
  will provide unlimited 24/7 Support to diagnose and solve any issues with the server.
- We will maintain and upgrade any hardware that is required to be upgraded as part of your monthly cost.
- There are no limits on the amount of traffic the hosted server or application can receive.
- Start with 16GB of Random Access Memory (RAM) and easily scale up, quickly and effortlessly
- All server network communication with the proper servers, IP Networks, DNS, and Internet is included in the monthly pricing

Any special licenses needed for the servers beyond the operating system license will be custom quoted to the customer prior to creating the virtual server instance. Also, any instances that require above 16TB or 32GB of RAM will be custom quoted.

### 2. General terms

### 2.1 Intellectual Property Rights

The Service Provider agrees to grant to the Buyer an exclusive, revocable, license for Windows Operating System, Microsoft Office 365, and Anti-Virus Software as part of the Services. Any software outside of this list will need to be licensed and paid for separately by the City of Pryor Creek. Fiber Interactive Technologies will install and support that software for the duration of this contract. Any upgrades to said software will be purchased by the City of Pryor Creek. For the purposes of this Clause 2.1, "Material" shall mean the materials, in whatever form, used by the Service Provider to provide the Services and the products, systems, programs or processes, in whatever form, provided by the Service Provider pursuant to this Agreement.

### 2.2 Warranty

- a. The Service Provider represents and warrants that:
  - i. it will perform the Services with reasonable care and skill; and
  - ii. the Services and the Materials provided by the Service Provider to the Buyer under this Agreement will not infringe or violate any intellectual property rights or other right of any third party.
  - iii. the Service Provider will respond either on site or by remote access within 4 hours to the issue reported by the City of Pryor Creek between the hours of 08:00 and 17:00 Monday thru Friday excluding holidays

### 2.3 Limitation of liability

- a. Subject to the Buyer's obligation to pay the Price to the Service Provider, either party's liability in contract, tort or otherwise (including negligence) arising directly out of or in connection with this Agreement or the performance or observance of its obligations under this Agreement and every applicable part of it shall be limited in aggregate to the Price.
- b. To the extent it is lawful to exclude the following heads of loss and subject to the Buyer's obligation to pay the Price, in no event shall either party be liable for any loss of profits, goodwill, loss of business, loss of data or any other indirect or consequential loss or damage whatsoever.

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c. Nothing in this Clause 2.3 will serve to limit or exclude either Party's liability for death or personal injury arising from its own negligence.

### 2.4 Term and Termination

- a. This Agreement shall be effective on the date hereof and shall continue, unless terminated sooner in accordance with Clause 2.4(b), until the Completion Date.
- b. Either Party may terminate this Agreement upon notice in writing if:
  - i. the other is in breach of any material obligation contained in this Agreement, which is not remedied (if the same is capable of being remedied) within 30 days of written notice from the other Party so to do: or
  - iii. a voluntary arrangement is approved, a bankruptcy or an administration order is made or a receiver or administrative receiver is appointed over any of the other Party's assets or an undertaking or a resolution or petition to wind up the other Party is passed or presented (other than for the purposes of amalgamation or reconstruction) or any analogous procedure in the country of incorporation of either party or if any circumstances arise which entitle the Court or a creditor to appoint a receiver, administrative receiver or administrator or to present a winding-up petition or make a winding-up order in respect of the other Party.
  - iii. 30 day written notice by either party prior to the first day of the 11<sup>th</sup> month of the current initial or renewal cycle. On the second day of the 11<sup>th</sup> month of the current cycle if a written notice to terminate has not been received by the other party, the auto-renewal will be exercised extending this contract by 13 months.
- c. Any termination of this Agreement (howsoever occasioned) shall not affect any accrued rights or liabilities of either Party nor shall it affect the coming into force or the continuance in force of any provision hereof which is expressly or by implication intended to come into or continue in force on or after such termination.

### 2.5 Relationship of the Parties

The Parties acknowledge and agree that the Services performed by the Service Provider, its employees, agents or sub-contractors shall be as an independent contractor and that nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to constitute a partnership, joint venture, agency relationship or otherwise between the parties.

### 2.6 Confidentiality

Neither Party will use, copy, adapt, alter or part with possession of any information of the other which is disclosed or otherwise comes into its possession under or in relation to this Agreement and which is of a confidential nature. This obligation will not apply to information which the recipient can prove was in its possession at the date it was received or obtained or which the recipient obtains from some other person with good legal title to it or which is in or comes into the public domain otherwise than through the default or negligence of the recipient or which is independently developed by or for the recipient.

### 2.7 Notices

Any notice which may be given by a Party under this Agreement shall be deemed to have been duly delivered if delivered by hand, first class post, facsimile transmission or electronic mail to the address of the other Party as specified in this Agreement or any other address notified in writing to the other Party. Subject to any applicable local law provisions to the contrary, any such communication shall be deemed to have been made to the other Party, if delivered by:

- a. first class post, 3 days from the date of posting;
- b. hand or by facsimile transmission, on the date of such delivery or transmission; and
- electronic mail, when the Party sending such communication receives confirmation of such delivery by electronic mail.

### 2.8 Miscellaneous

a. The failure of either party to enforce its rights under this Agreement at any time for any period shall not be construed as a waiver of such rights.

- If any part, term or provision of this Agreement is held to be illegal or unenforceable neither the validity or enforceability of the remainder of this Agreement shall be affected.
- Neither Party shall assign or transfer all or any part of its rights under this Agreement without the consent of the other Party.
- This Agreement may not be amended for any other reason without the prior written agreement of both Parties.
- This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding between the Parties relating to the subject matter
- hereof unless any representation or warranty made about this Agreement was made fraudulently and, save as may be expressly referred to or referenced herein, supersedes all prior representations, writings, negotiations or understandings with respect hereto.

  Neither Party shall be liable for failure to perform or delay in performing any obligation under this Agreement if the failure or delay is caused by any circumstances beyond its reasonable control, including but not limited to acts of god, war, civil commotion or industrial dispute. If such delay or failure continues for at least 7 days, the Party not affected by such delay or failure shall be entitled to terminate this Agreement by notice in
- This Clause 2.8(g) and Clauses 2.3, 2.5, 2.6, 2.7 and 2.8 of this Agreement shall survive any termination or expiration.
- This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the jurisdiction in which the Buyer is located (or if the Buyer is based in more than one country, the country in which its headquarters are located) (the "Territory") and the parties agree to submit disputes arising out of or in connection with this Agreement to the non-exclusive of the courts in the Territory.




